


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

John Thurrott

Our family descends from John Thurrott, known as "Long John". He was the son of James and the wife left in Scotland. John arrived in Canada (from Annan Water, Newton Stewart, Scotland) when he was twelve, with his father, a sister Agnes and the nursemaid.

In 1836 John purchased land in New Brunswick and worked a farm (Land was purchased from Alexander McMichael. It was on the south side of West Branch, Weldford, N.B.)."

John married Mary Jane Morton, the daughter of James Morton and Mary MacMichael. They came from the same county in Scotland (Kircudbrightshire) as James did." They had a large family of 12 children. He was reputed to be a stern disciplinarian.

Grampa had a list of the twelve children (it was from this list that I first started on my genealogy journey). It included such details as hair color and complexion of each child. Here are a few details about the twelve children of Long John Thurrott."


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
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

The Boston Transcript Genealogy Column ran about 4 times a week from 1896 to 1941. The column contained queries posted to further the writer's family research. While no sources are listed, the information printed about individuals gives significant clues about vital statistics which might not be found anywhere else.

J., March 8, 1771, married her cousin, Ebenezer Byram Ayres, Nov. 3, 1797. He was a son of Silas Ayres of Morrls County, N. J., and Mary Byram, daughter of Ebenezer (2) Byram. They resided a short time in Morristown, N. J., then removed to Newburgh, N. Y., where they remained until 1814, when they settled on a new farm near New Lexington, Ohio. Seven daughters and two sons were born to them. She died Aug. 23, 1830. Then he married Miss Janette McKeney as his second wife. He died in New Lexington, March 20, 1853, aged seventy-nine years. His second wife died a few years later, aged eighty-four years. 2. Amy, born near Morristown, N. J., Nov. 17, 1774; married Samuel Halliday, near Morristown, May 8, 1803. He was the son of David Halliday and Margaret Moffat of New York State. After his marriage Samuel and his wife Amy resided in Morristown, and he was county sheriff a number of years. He also served as a member of the State Legislature of New Jersey in 1815-17. They removed to ... Newark, N. J., in 1824, and to New York city in 1826. Here he died Jan. 4, 1842, aged sixty-seven years. His widow died at the home of her danmater, Mrs. Timothy D. Wilcox, in Ithaca, N. Y., Nov. 18, 1849.

3. Ebenezer was born near Morristown, N. J., April 9, 1778, and married Mary (Polly) Little, March 22, 1800. She was a daughter of Nathaniel Little and Mary Caldwell of Lyons Farms. Union County, N. J., and was born May 10, 1783. They resided in Morristown until 1803, when they went west and settled in Warren County. Ohio. They had twelve children. He died Oct. 12, 1822. His widow married Samuel Robinson of New Harrison, Ohio, April 24, 1824. Two sons were born to them.

4. Huldah, born in New Jersey, Nov. 19, 1779, married Loammi Moore, a hardware merchant of Morristown, N. J., March 30, 1799. He was a son of David Moore and Bethiah Cutter of Rockaway, N. J., where he was born April 12, 1776. They had twelve children. He died June 25, 1899, from injuries received by being crushed by a building that was being moved in Morristown. Shedied at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Dr. Traili Green, in Easton, Pa., Oct. 18, 1899. They were both burled in the old churchyard adjoining the First Presbyterian Church, in Morristown, N. J.

 Susan, born in New Jersey, Jan. 22, 1782. She resided with her parents and conducted a private school for girls, in Morristown, N. J., a number of years. She

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never married. She died in ---6. Silas Condict, born near Morristown, N. J., Nov. 24, 1783; married Ann Van Coe Brown, about 1804. She was a daughter of David and Mary Brown of Madison, N. J. Silva Condict and wife resided in Morr's County, N. J., until 1828, when they removed to a farm near Liberty Corper, N J. In the fail of 1836 they removed to Succasunna Plains, Morris County, N. J. Here they remained until about 1840 or 1841, when, with their son, Silas P., and daughter, Delia A., they moved to Dayton, Ohio, where one or two married daughters and a sister resided. Thirteen children were born to them, all 'n New Jersey. He died Nov. 23, 1844, and was buried at Dayton. A few years later his widow returned to New Jersey and made her home with her son, David N. Byram. near Madison, N. J., where she died Jan. 5. 1848, aged sixty-two years.


